

Board Retreat at Shadow Rest



Lemon Lime Dessert (from Christmas Party)

Ingredients: graham crackers, butter, 2 cook & serve lemon pudding, 2 lime jello, half & half

Crust: 1 1/2 sleeves graham crackers with 1/4 cup butter/margarine

—Crush graham crackers and mix with butter, press into pan.

Topping: 2 pkgs. Cook & serve lemon pudding

—Cook pudding per directions. While pudding is hot, add 2 pkgs. lime jello dry ingredients—mix well. Then add one cup cold water and one cup half & half. Pour into pie shell. Cool several hours/overnight before serving.


