Meeting was opened with welcome from President Kelly Irvin. There was 1 guest, Norma Darby, and no new members introduced.

Donna McKinney of the Rusty Moon gave a program on how her shop was started, and how she works with wool. Then she showed many examples of her outstanding wool pieces.

July birthdays, Betty Murray, Cheryl Tuschhoff, Maxine Michel, Donna Heuer, Saphrona Brewington, Debbie Carlton, Patti Lessmann, Betty Phillips, Debbie Morris, Nancy Kester, Pat Stokes, Darlene Crocker, Sally Miller, Connie Cossou, and Kaitlyn Weber were given gifts by Jo Payne and sung to.

It was announced that if there were questions about sleeves to see Barb Egbert or Karla Kiefner. Everyone who took the barn quilt class last month showed them.

We then had break to look at wool samples, and to buy wool and patterns. A motion was made by Deb Riley to approve the June minutes, seconded by Mary Kay Reed, and was passed.

There was discussion about a place for pre-meeting dinner other than Panera. It was decided to see where the speaker preferred to go each month and send an email to members.

Lisa O'Brien announced next month's program would be a fiber art journey by Karen Linduska and that the fat quarter would be 30's.

Ravan Simms told us about the class that would be tomorrow from 10-2 at the Jackson library for \$25 on making a pincushion from wool. Next month's class will be 08-13 from 11-1 on using fancy machine stitches. The class is \$10 and the kit is \$20. Wooly Gals will be meeting 07-14 at Donna Kiel's house and will be having pizza.

Madeline Gieselman had us sign up for quilt show pins, asked for log cabin quilts to be hung around the arena, announced the scissors sharpener for the show, and said sign-ups for various jobs would be next month. Barb Egbert wants quilt pictures and registrations in ASAP, passed around a sign-up sheet for the 27th, and talked about sleeves. Kelly Irvin requested quilts for the bed turning that nod to the mod.

There was no report from community quilts. Barb Egbert requested us to bring in our batiks for the opportunity quilt. Carla Wren gave us some quilt tips and showed us the gadget of the month which was a ruler stand.

Karla Kiefner had everyone show their port and starboard blocks. She showed us the next block, Eagle's Nest.

Nancy Bishop said 2 more comfort quilts went out leaving only a few. Size will be emailed so members could replenish the supply. There were no reports on Quilts of Valor or the retreat in March.
