Minutes 09-10-18

Linda Tansil said she would collect any buy it now items tonight for the quilt show. Lisa O'Brien announced next month's speaker would be Erika Plank and the fat quarter would be Halloween.

Ravan Simms announced that on October 9 from 10am to 4 pm would be a Cathedral Windows pillow class. She also said that anyone wanting to meet for a movie at 1pm at the theater on September 11 would be welcome. Wooly Gals will be meeting on October 6 at Honey Baked Ham at noon.

Set up for the show will start at 8am on Friday September 28. 100 quilts have been registered and challenge quilts are still needed.
