August Minutes

Meeting was opened by Kelly Irvin. She announced that Mike Hart is selling Sharon's quilting stuff. August birthdays-Dee Carter, Cheryl Amos, Betty Meyer, Cindy Spaeth, Marie Todd, Carolyn Andrews, Carla Fisher, Ravan Simms, Karen Bates, Christina Ludwig, and Jane Weber-were sung to and given gifts from Maxine Michel. We had 71 members, 1 new member, Laura Stidham, and 6 guests, Stephanie Cato, Beverly McNeal, Vicky Fields, Donna Essner, Rose Nary Oxner, and Jane Weber, present.

Christine Childers introduced the program, Penny Haren, a Creative Grids ambassador, who told us that they have 122 different rulers and gave a very funny trunk show. There was then a break so that rulers and patterns could be bought.

Mary Green asked for help to put up the QOV display at the fair. Pam Lewis made a motion to approve the July minutes, seconded by Jo Payne. Motion passed. Treasurer's report was read by Kelly Irvin.

Christine Childers announced the fat quarter for next month is stripes. Next month will be the picnic. There will be 2 classes tomorrow. In October there is a class on October 19 from 9-12:30 at Hanover Lutheran Church by Kristy Daum. It will be on the Modern Disappearing 9 patch. The cost is \$30 and the cutting homework will be on the web site. Money must be in by October 7.

Maxine Michel told about next month's picnic at Cape County Park South. Payment of \$10 must be in by August 20. It will be catered by Port Cape. The picnic will start at 6pm with a trunk sale starting at 5pm.

Nancy Bishop had the Goid Neighbors and Eccentric Starts cabins show the comfort quilts they made.
