
Dear Darla,



How to Make a Cheap Sewing Table


The basic idea is a fold up table with a layer of foam such as used to insulate the walls of the house the same size as the top of the table. Put your machine on the foam, trace the base, and then cut the foam with an electric knife (the best) or a serrated knife. Then cut a second layer of foam that fits up snug to the top of your sewing surface. Buy two pieces of foam so that their total thickness adds up to the height of your sewing surface. This gives you a flat sewing surface the size of your table. p

There's a second video that shows how to cut the foam and how to convert the table for machine quilting a large quilt.



MY FAVORITE GADGET:

The Clover Desk Needle Threader:
When your eyes can no longer see the eye of the needle well enough to thread a needle, this gadget can take over. You push your needle down into the hole, lay your thread in the groove, push a button and your needle is threaded. It takes a tiny bit of practice to get the knack of it. You need to hold the thread down while you push the button.


