Time to take a deep breath. I think I am ready for the show. Madeline





FREE BAR QUILT PATTERN — Maybe the world's easiest quilt to make at http://www.pbtex.com/PBTex WHISpink.pdf


Go to the website for full directions and a color picture. This quilt uses 3/8 yard each of nine different fabrics. Cut in 3 1/2 inch wide strips. Cut these into various lengths from 3 inches to 15 inches long, or approximately six to ten cut pieces from each original strip.

Sew them end to end, switching colors randomly to make the vertical rows. If you want to be artistic about it, you could lay it all out on a design wall (or on the flannel side of a flannel-backed vinyl tablecloth. You need 16 pieced vertical rows.

Sew the vertical rows together and press the seam allowances all in one direction.

Proceed as usual for a quilt. You need 1/2 yard fabric for the binding (cut in 2 1/4 inch strips). You need 3 1/4 yard for the backing.

The online pattern gives you exact fabric to buy to make the quilt in the picture. The website has other free quilting patterns. Including a patterns for an ironing board cover. http://www.pbtex.com/html/free_patterns.html.


