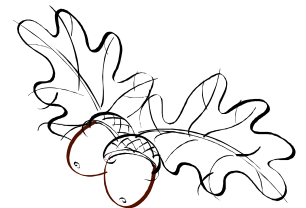

September Program:

Barb Bolesta, Sewing Room Organization. Barb is a requested and returning guest to our guild for the Sept. meeting. She is also willing to do a couple of workshops. <http://www.barbbolesta.com/>



On Sunday afternoon, Sept 12, (1 - 4 p.m.) she will teach "free-motion heirloom quilting" using our regular sewing machines. There will be techniques of stippling or meandering, in-the-ditch, continuous-line block and border patterns, echo, outline and other filler patterns which will be taught and practiced. There will be also discussions and demonstrations of specialty and metallic threads, batting, stenciling, marking, presser feet and needles.

On Monday morning, Sept 13, (10:30 - 1:00 pm) Barb will be teaching an applique class called "Snowflake Fantasy". It will be presented as hand-applique or fusible machine-applique. Only two fabrics are needed for this unique wallhanging of four different snowflake blocks with additional corner and center motif designs.

Both workshops **will be held in the Sewing Basket's classroom at the Golden Needle.**

Individual classes will cost \$ 12.00 ; however, if you choose to take both classes, the fee will be \$ 20.00. If you have not already signed up during the August meeting, please contact Mary Green at 335-0656/450-6696. Supply lists will be sent to you.

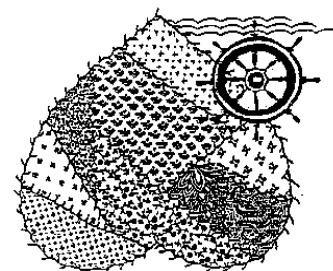
